David Bradley gives a voice to the voiceless. For nearly three decades, David has been the preeminent advocate in Washington, D.C. working closely with the Congressional leadership, both Democratic and Republican, and with numerous Administrations, to ensure federal policies related to major social service programs make a difference in the lives of low-income Americans. In a town full of corporate lobbyists, David Bradley has created with his government relations firm Moss, McGee, Bradley and Colbert, a unique niche, specializing in assisting low income programs and nonprofit organizations with their legislative and regulatory needs.

David is the founder and Executive Director of the National Community Action Foundation, a private, non-profit advocacy organization that represents the nation's network of 1100 Community Action Agencies (CAA). These agencies coordinate the array of available federal social service programs at the local level, serving 14 million low income Americans of all ages each day. As the principle author of the Community Services Block Grant, which provides the core funding to the nation's CAA network, David has enabled CAAs to leverage almost nine billion dollars in other federal, state, local and private resources. He also crafted a major portion of the McKinney Act, which provides homelessness assistance to a wide variety of social service agencies.

Along with his work with low income programs, David serves as the CEO of both the National Workforce Association and USA Works!, organizations focused on working with Congress and the Executive branch to design and fund a world class job training system for America. David's expertise and success advocating on behalf of social service programs have led other nations in Eastern Europe and Africa to express interest in having him help design a social service system that will empower low-income individuals seeking a way out of poverty.

David has a Bachelors and Masters degree from George Washington University. In 1987, he was a Senior Executive Fellow at the Harvard University John F. Kennedy School of Government. He served in President Carter's Administration as Congressional Liason at the Small Business Administration. In his spare time, David is part owner of several minor league baseball teams including the Albuquerque Isotopes, Bowie Baysox and the Frederick Keys.
